FOND PLAIN IMPROVEMENT ASSOCIATION

- 1908 Mem in Pond Plain met weekly in a barn on Thicket St. playing Pinochle to pass the tome. Our records of March 1909 show that eight fire alarm fires were put out at a cost of \$16.25. There were 17 no alarm fires.

 In the beginning it was "Bucket Brigade" until a chemical engine was acquired. We still have the bell used on the chemical engine and firemen's badges.

 This "Independent Chemical Fire Department" was chartered by the state in 1910. and was active until the town built and manned a fire station in So. Weymouth.
- 1912 The "Pord Plain Improvement Association" was chartered by the state in 1912.
- 1914 The wives of this fire department formed a "Ladie's Auxiliary", The "Eureka Club". It was started with 48 members. Our president, William Taylor's grandmother was president of the auxiliary in 1919. By 1923 they had 118 members.
- 1919 A building fund was started. Bill Taylor's grandfather, as a member of the building committee carried stones in his wheelbarrow for the foundation of the hall built in 1923 --- mortgage paid off in 1962. The mem of the organization did much of the work. Hembers were taxed 10¢ amonth to purchase a piano in 1904. The hall offered the opportunity to bring civic problems before the organization for discussion and group action.

 Money was raised by having annual fairs, musicals, card parties, dinners, even selling magazine subscriptions, auctions, rammage sales. One of our rummage sales produced an 1864 Weymouth Commemorative plate we donated to the Wey. Historical Society. Since the Ladie's Auxiliary was needed for money raising, it was decided a merger would be advantageous. The ladies and men consolidated in 1941.

 We originally owned the land from fond St. back to the R.R. tracks to rte.18.

 Most of it was a pine grove. We allowed cutting of the wood for \$2.00 a cord. We leased part of our land to the town of Weymouth for playground purposes.
- 1949-50 We sold much of the land to a developer -- This is now the Thomas Rd. area. We needed the money for a heating system instead of using coal and wood. IMPROVEMENTS:
- Worked to build the Pond School, later renamed for principal Alice Fulton/
 Adequate lighting for Oakden Ave., Improving conditions at the h.R. station at
 the corner of Pond & Hollis Sts. Tried to get bus service for our area.

 Sponsored branches of Tufts Libraries in two of our member's homes before branches
 were built. Worked for water mains and Electric service. Raised money to provide
 a victrola for Fond School. Denated to the Wey. Hespital Annex; In the 1930's
 with "Sunshine Bags" members put a penny in a bag on each sunny day.

 Made denations to the V.N.A., a flower fund for shut-ins, food baskets for the poor.

1941 Worked with selectmen for signs at intersections in So. Wey. & police guards at school crossings. Traffic Lights at Independence Sq.

1945 The planting of 150 maple trees on Fond St.

1953 The Negus Flayground at the Pond School was dedicated in honor of Arthur Negus, a P.P.I.A. member for 35 years.

1966-67 & again in 1974 our member Robert Park proposed the playground on Thicket St. named for our member and fireman in Weymouth. Richard Gifford.

EARLY MEETINGS:

Talks on Landscaping, Women's Suffrage, American Poets, clambakes, annual picnics at No. Scituate beach in summer. Garden Tea Parties, meeting on the Gypsy Moth problem, Nutrition classes. Early dances charged 25¢ admission.
